PROPOSED BYLAWS CHANGES

1. Two signatures on ALL checks are presently required. The Welty Board of Directors recommends changing this & amending the Section 8.4 of the By Laws.

Section 8.4: Expenses.

The funds of FWEC, however acquired, shall be expended in accordance with the provisions of Article 2. All expenditures shall be by check approved or authorized by the Board of Directors ~~and signed by two authorized officers~~ or by Board approved electronic transfer.

ADD: One signature is required for checks under \$1,000.00 and Board-approved routine payroll checks.

Two authorized signatures will be required on all other checks.

2. As a result of our 2009 audit the Board of Directors recommends that the following task be added to the job description of the treasurer Section 5.5 of the By Laws.

Section 5.5: Treasurer.

The Treasurer shall:

ADD: H. Be responsible to see that a financial risk management policy and procedures are in place and followed.

These changes will be voted on by the membership at the Friends of Welty Environmental Center Annual meeting on April 11, 2010 at 2:00 taking place at The Beloit Historical Society Lincoln Center.

We will also elect new Board members. The offices to be filled by election at the 2010 annual meeting are: Vice president (3 yr. term), 4 directors for 2 year terms and 1 director for 1 year term. If you are interested in any of these positions please contact Jan Knutson:
