PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE BY JAN KNUTSON



A couple weeks ago we burned our prairie — a yearly spring event for our family, friends, neighbors and even some Beloit College fraternity guys. It was a little windy that Saturday morning, but we made a plan and decided to burn. All went well and now, as we already see the greening and growth of the prairie, we can hardly wait for the summer field of fireflies and native wildflowers.

Our prairie burn brought to mind a couple lessons that can apply to Welty:



- Lesson # 1...The importance of renewal. Even though our prairie looked charred and black and naked that Saturday, I know that the burning was necessary for new growth and rejuvenation of the tall grass habitat. This same principle of renewal applies at Welty. Even though it was sad to say goodbye to some of our board and committee members ending their terms in April, I know that we have a great group of new board members that are ready to carry on the Welty mission and traditions.

- Lesson # 2...The importance of a good plan and great volunteers. When I called the town fire department to report that we were going to burn that Saturday morning, the fireman diplomatically asked, "So, how's the wind out there?" It was indeed a somewhat windy morning for our burn, but we

had a good plan and lots of volunteers and everything went well. The same kind of good planning is important at Welty. With a good plan and our great volunteers we can accomplish anything! DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Spring has certainly sprung at the Welty Environmental Center! My old friends, the ephemeral spring wildflowers, are blooming each in their turn in the Oak Savanna. I saw my first group of newly hatched goslings the other day. And just today as I took a walk the toad calls were all I could hear in the wetlands! Though spring in the Stateline always seems to be too short for me. In fact, I have already turned my attention to the excitement of summer.

Any children 14 years or older who have aged out of most of Welty's summer programming but would still like to be involved are welcome to join us as volunteer Junior Naturalists. We will be hosting an orientation for new and previous Junior Naturalist volunteers on Monday, June 14 from 9am to 3pm. We will train for summer programs, get a chance to know each other, and even have some fun. No need to bring a lunch – we'll feed you today! Please register at 608-361-1377 by Friday, June 11 so we know who to expect. Thank you!

This year marks the first time the Welty Environmental Center has hosted a day camp program, and we will have two weeks that you can participate in. The first week, June 21-25, will be our Kick-Off to Summer week. Each day of the camp runs from 9am to 3pm, and we'll meet every day, Monday through Friday. Each day will be filled with exploration, environmental education, crafts, and free play in nature. Children ages 6 to 12 years are invited to attend, and we welcome any Junior Naturalist volunteers who want to help any or all of the camp days. A week of camp costs only \$60 for Welty members, and \$75 for nonmembers. A limited



amount of scholarships will be available from the Rock County Conservationists. What a deal! If you and your family are interested in extending the experience, please join us for a Family Night on Friday, June 25 at 6:30pm. Genencor's sponsorship will provide treats as campers share skits, songs and crafts from the week. For \$10 more per Welty member family, \$15 for each nonmember family, your whole family can set up a tent at Beckman Mill County Park and enjoy an evening of stargazing, night hikes, and campfire fun as Friday turns to Saturday. A second week of day camp, A Survivor Theme, will take place from August 9-13. We only have space for 30 campers each week, so sign up early! Jessica Buchberger, who has been Welty's Duffy intern from Beloit College all year, will be staying on to help during camp as our summer intern. We're very excited to have her a little longer.

For adults and families we will be taking a few evenings to explore some natural areas throughout the region. June 17 we will meet at Colored Sands Forest Preserve, just a few short miles from Beckman Mill, at 5:30pm. In July we will explore Magnolia Bluff County Park, and August will find us on Clinton's Pelishek-Tiffany Nature Trail. I hope you can join us. THE SCRAP METALS DRIVE

On April 17, 2010 FWEC held its first scrap metals drive, as a fund-raising event, in the main parking lot at Beckman Mill Park.. Stateline Recycling Company, Janesville, Wisconsin provided, at no charge, a huge, 20 ft. long dumpster and hauled away its contents to be recycled. About 30 people brought scrap to donate. It came in cars, pickup trucks or trailers. During the three-hour metals drive a total of 7740 pounds of steel and other metals were collected, filling the dumpster. \$541.80 was raised. Our thanks to everyone who helped with the drive and to all the people who brought scrap to donate. We're thinking of doing this again next year!

THE GRANDFATHER CLOCK THAT CARL BUILT BY DICK NEWSOME

It stands 7 foot 3 inches tall and the inside of the door is inscribed “Susan Welty Christmas 1954” The luster and color of its fine finish are undiminished. This is the grandfather clock that Carl Welty made. It now is in the keeping of the Friends group to grace a room in our future, permanent center building.

The clock came to our attention when Joel Welty, Carl’s nephew, emailed to say that he and Elinore would like to donate the clock to the Welty Center. The clock came to them after Carl’s death, as Susan was moving into an apartment ; leaving their home on Spring Brook, of which many of our readers will have fond memories. Shirley and I visited Joel and Elinore at their home in Blanchard, Michigan to discover that the clock was much too large to fit into our car. We made arrangements with Shirley’s brother to bring the clock to Beloit on their next visit.

With the clock came papers which Susan had annotated, giving details about the making of the clock. Two papers are sales slips from Robert Notman, Antique and Curio Dealer, Edinburgh, Scotland. One sheet noting the purchase by Prof. Carl Welty of “clock movement 1825” for 3.0.0 pounds. The second sheet lists purchase of “grandfather clock works” for 3.0.0 pounds. Did Carl pay 6.0.0 pounds, or is one sheet a duplicate receipt with different wording?

Susan wrote on one of the sheets that “Clock face, when we bought it, had 4 hoop skirted ladies , one in each corner outside the numerals. They were crudely painted so Carl repainted the face. There appeared

to be the name “Simpson” very faintly visible on the face. Joel Peters *, in Carl Welty – His life and The Life of Birds , page 31, writes that on a trip to Edinburgh “They bought a last souvenir from an antique shop on the Royal Mile; a hundred-year-old grandfather’s clock face and works, and had it shipped to Beloit.”

Also among the papers are drawings of cabinets for grandfather clocks which Carl drew. One sheet is a very detailed drawing with measurements of ‘Catherine’s clock La Cross Nov 24. 1953.’ This would be Catherine Crail, Susan’s sister . Two other sheets are drawings by Carl that illustrate a few models for clock cabinets which Carl considered for housing the works from Edinburgh, and one of the model he made.

He was an accomplished craftsman and made several pieces of fine furniture for their home. These are disbursed, except for the clock , now returned to be placed in the Welty Environmental Center. Joel and Elinore also donated a large charcoal sketch of Carl. These, along with recollections and writings by several people, will help us pass along to future board members, staff and visitors a sense of why the Center honors Carl and Susan by having it bear their name.
